

PRIVACY NOTICE

Honeybourne Parish Council respects your privacy and is committed to protecting the personal information we hold of people who use our services.

In the privacy policy references to 'we' or 'us' refer to Honeybourne Parish Council, Honeybourne Village Hall, Harvest Close, Honeybourne, Evesham, WR11 7HR.

When you contact us

The information you provide (personal information such as name, address, email address, phone number, organisation) will be processed and stored to enable us to contact you and respond to your correspondence, provide information and/or access our facilities and services. Your personal information will not be shared or provided to any other third party without your consent.

The Councils Right to Process Information

Information Security

Honeybourne Parish Council has a duty to ensure the security of personal data. We make sure that your information is protected from unauthorised access, loss, manipulation, falsification, destruction or unauthorised disclosure. This is done through appropriate technical measures and appropriate policies. Copies of these policies can be requested.

We will only keep your data for the purpose it was collected for and only for as long as is necessary. After which it will be deleted. You may request the deletion of your data held by Honeybourne Parish Council at any time.

Children

We will not process any data relating to a child (under 13) without the express parental/ guardian consent of the child concerned.

Our Website

Honeybourne Parish Council respects your privacy. We do not intend to identify you through your use of this website. Your visit to our website is anonymous (no personal information about you is recorded or gathered) unless you fill in the contact form.

Data which allows us to recognise you, your preferences and how you use this website. This saves you from re-entering information when you return to the site. This data is collected by cookies from your navigation around the site. A cookie is a small amount of data which we send to your computer. The data is then stored on your

browser or hard disk. Your IP address (this is your computer's individual identification number) which is automatically logged by our web server. This is used to note your interest in our website.

By submitting your information, you consent to the use of that information as set out in this policy. If for any reason our policy does change, we will post the change on this page to be viewed.

It is not possible for us to predict the route which the information will travel (due to the Internet's infrastructure being a global one); this means your information may be temporarily transferred outside the European Economic Area. By submitting your information you consent to this transfer.

By submitting your information and using our website, you consent to the collection, storage and processing of your personal data by us in the manner set out in this policy. Your data is not stored anywhere on this website. It is emailed to us where it is stored in a safe password protected environment. We will use your data solely for the sole purpose of corresponding with you.

Cookie Policy

Cookies are small pieces of data, usually in text files, that are placed on your computer to record information about you and your activity on our website. A cookie is a simple text file that is stored on your computer or mobile device by a website's server and only that server will be able to retrieve or read the contents of that cookie.

Cookies do lots of different jobs, like letting you navigate between pages efficiently, storing your preferences and generally improving your experience of a website. Cookies make the interaction between you and the website easier and faster.

There are two types of Cookies used on our website:

The cookies are not malicious and can be disabled should you wish.
